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Definitions

- “Number of Students Who Began the Program” means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- “Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- “Number of On-time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- “On-time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- “Graduates Unavailable for Employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- “Graduates Employed in the Field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for who the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six month period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- “Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- “Number of Graduates Taking Exam” is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.



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- “First Available Exam Date” is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- “Passage Rate” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam for the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- “Number Who Passed First Available Exam” is the number of graduates who took the passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- “Salary” is as reported by graduate or graduate’s employer.
- “No Salary Information Reported” is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information



STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

Upon enrollment to the program, students will be given class reservation which cannot be made available to other students. The Enrollment does not constitute a binding contract until a School Official signs and approves the agreement. If the agreement was not accepted, all monies paid by the student will be refunded less administrative cost. Students have the right to cancel the Enrollment Agreement until midnight of the seventh business day (_____) following the first scheduled class session. Cancellation of agreement will be made effective upon receipt of the written notice of cancellation from the student at the school address shown on the first page of the Enrollment Agreement. A signed and dated notice of cancellation may be sent by ordinary / certified mail, hand delivered, or by telegram.

The Notice of Cancellation, if sent by mail, becomes effective when deposited with the United Postal Office properly addressed and postage pre-paid. Medical Allied Career Center, Inc. is not responsible for lost mail or delayed delivery because of incorrect address. The written Notice of Cancellation does not need to take a particular form or however expressed to become effective. It is required that the student states that he/she no longer desires to be bound by the Enrollment Agreement. Student desiring to cancel their Enrollment Agreement shall receive a refund of all or a portion of the monies paid within 45 days of cancellation.

A student wishing to cancel the Enrollment Agreement on purchased equipment as a separate charge and returned it in good condition (allowing for allowance for wear and tear) within 30 days following date of cancellation, the school will refund the cost paid by the student. If the student failed to return the equipment within the 30-day period, the School will not refund the portion of the monies paid by the student documented cost of the equipment. The student may retain the equipment without any financial obligation to the school.

This institution shall refund 100% of the amount paid for institutional charges, less a reasonable deposit or application fee not to exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250), if the notice of cancellation is made through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later.

If the student has received federal student aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.
